



Tribute to Bruce Hepler (1965-2019)






Bruce was a judge at the show for many years. He succumbed to a heart attach at age 53 and was taken to be with our Lord.




#### ~ A MESSAGE FROM THE HEPLER FAMILY ~

# Heaven



- ★ Many thanks to Lazy K Sweet Corn & Sons (since 1972)! Scott Kok donates all cost, labor and organizing the planning so that the Car show has fresh, locally grown sweet corn each year.
- ★ Another home-run hit new this year was Mac & Cheese thanks to Vickie, Jared & Eileen!

- ★ A gentleman from Kansas City, MO drove his show car to Pardeeville to be part of our event this year!
- ★ The support of many businesses, the Village of Pardeeville, our law enforcement, and the body of Christ is humbling and encouraging to the Car Show organizers. This year was a record-breaking year all around!
- ★ In addition to the \$20,000 raised from concessionsales, another \$300 gift was given to support Grace Presbyterian's food pantry!

## BULLDOG STOMP Cancer Run-Walk



The Bulldog Stomp Cancer Run-Walk will host its 12th annual event on May 2, 2020. I was there when the ideas for having a run-walk was born. One of my high school student council members, named Nicole, had recently found out that a co-worker had been diagnosed with breast cancer, and Nicole wanted to do something to support her friend. Her and four other members of the student council settled on the idea of a run-walk as a great way to both help a friend and do something good for their community.

I remember the day they proposed the idea to me. I was very apprehensive about it. First because I wasn't sure if a small group of teenagers could pull off such an event, and secondly, I wondered if the community would show up and support them? Either way, I realized that it was my responsibility as their adviser and teacher, to do everything I could to help them be successful.

With the help of some very dedicated parents and community members, the students spent many hours meeting and planning. Everything was new! Where would we hold the event? Where would the course go? What do we need to do to get the event approved by the school and village? Who would print the shirts, and what would the design be? How much would

we charge? To whom would we donate the funds raised? So many logistics were involved that it is still a wonder to me that it ever got off the ground.

I encouraged the students to set a goal for attendance and they decided that 100 people would be a good start. Once the we advertised the event and word began to get out, the gift basket donations and registrations started coming in. It was really exciting for the kids and served to motivate them even more. I think we eventually received over 200 pre-registrations. The day of the event came, and it was a beautiful spring day. Over 400 people participated that day and the students raised over \$8,000 dollars. We were over the moon with pride and happiness. Every year after that a new group of students would pick up the baton and continue the event, and almost every year it has grown in size and money raised.

The Pardeeville Car and Truck Show is an event similar to ours, in that it was created by young Pardeeville Students that wanted to make a difference in their community. It's a fantastic event that started around the same time as the Bulldog Stomp. Over the years the two events have grown enormously and have become fixtures of the community. We recognize our similar roles, and try our best to support one another. In

fact, the P.C.T.S. has helped raise thousands of dollars in support of the Bulldog Stomp and cancer research.

As I said, when my students first came to me with the idea of organizing a big event, I was very skeptical that they would have the skills to pull it off. However, I could not have been more wrong. Both of these events teach us that when we value our young people and their ideas, they will add even greater value to our communities.

## DID YOU KNOW?

The car show was blessed to have a 2 Star Major General as our guess speaker and a presentation Honoring all Armed Forces with special and unique traveling Bell of Honor while we celebrated our 10th annual event. It was a very moving presentation.
